FUNDS AND CONTRIBUTION PROGRAMS

The following funds and programs were established to meet specific needs at Gift of Life Transplant House. If you would like to donate to one of these funds, please indicate that on your check, or include a note with your gift. We are grateful for all donations, memorials and tributes. Contributions not specified for a fund or program will be used where there is a need within the campus.

Edward P. Pompeian Fund

This fund, named in honor of Gift of Life Transplant House founder, supports guests and caregivers with special needs, such as transportation, food or personal items.

Susan Powers Helping Hands Fund

A transplant patient and house guest, Susan Powers established this fund to assist guests with financial needs of lodging at Gift Life Transplant House.

Katie Hickman Fund

The Hickman family began this fund in memory of their daughter to provide furnishings and campus maintenance.
