

DEAR FRIENDS:

We are pleased to provide you with the 2016 - 2017 Annual Report of the activities of the Gift of Life Transplant House.



s we say goodbye to the last two years and continue on our journey into 2018, we at Gift of Life Transplant House are very grateful. As we look back on 2016 and 2017, there were both the high and lows, and I would like to briefly share those with you.

2016 and 2017 marked our 32^{nd} and 33^{rd} years of service respectively to our community, our guests, and our caregivers. We voted best chef and ate our way through the incredible food at our 3^{rd} annual Iron Chef Challenge, ran our tails off at the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} annual Timmay 5K in April, sunk (or missed) a lot of putts at our 32^{nd} and 33^{rd} annual golf tournament, and danced the night away at the annual Gala of the Decades; the 1980s and 1950s.

From a board of directors and staff level, we had two excellent years. Our incredible staff worked their way through what were two incredibly busy years, and, as always, did an unbelievable job. We also saw the retirement of our former executive director, Ginger Holmes and welcomed our new executive director, Mary Wilder. I cannot thank Ginger enough for everything she did for the organization over the years. Her passion and love for Gift of Life never went unnoticed, and she was always there to greet everyone with a warm smile. A ROOM WAITING

In loving memory of Mike Gengler.

Room Waiting. That's the entry on Mike Gengler's Caring Bridge site for October 30, 2013 – "Good News! Mike has a room waiting at Gift of Life Transplant House" and that's how we came to know Mike and Brenda Gengler. Owners of Gulden's Restaurant in Maplewood, MN, Mike was diagnosed with colon cancer in September 2010 and shortly after he was told the cancer was in remission, doctors discovered that Mike had a second cancer – multiple myeloma.

His Caring Bridge site chronicles his 100 day Stem Cell Transplant journey to treat the myeloma, his embarrassment over the slippers Brenda had

brought for him to wear and the many, many friends he made while staying at the house. The transplant was only partially successful, which meant that Mike participated in multiple trials which involved chemo and other treatments.

Last month friends of Mike and Brenda's called Gift of Life Transplant House to say that Mike's battle with cancer was

nearing an end, but even during this time, Mike was determined that family and friends remember Gift of Life Transplant House. His Caring Bridge site says, *"There are lots of inquiries coming in about how people can help. Here's*

Mike decided to spend his remaining months making crafts that could be sold at his funeral and he requested that Gift of Life Transplant House provide brochures and donation envelopes so that family and friends could easily make donations to the house. On March 8, 2018 Mike lost his battle with cancer but his

courage, integrity, wit and friendship have been an inspiration. And we are quite sure that as Mike took his last breath, he heard the words – "Come on in – we have a room waiting".

THE POWER OF A WHITE BOARD



ne of our caregivers recently suggested we install white boards in each house. She thought it would be a great way to collaborate with other guests and caregivers going grocery shopping or running errands.


We thought It was a great suggestion and posted the request on Facebook. Within two hours, we were notified that the white boards were on their way!

But something remarkable happened once the large white boards were hung. It started with someone drawing a heart and then someone else drew a flower! And then the messages began—notes of encouragement, Bible verses, updates about guests, thank yous to the staff...And not once has there been a grocery list or request that someone pick up an item for someone else.

The power of those white boards is the power of encouragement and gratitude and those two attitudes are abundant at Gift of Life Transplant House. Recently, Ron told me that he was completely opposed to coming to Gift of Life Transplant House. He already felt isolated because of his illness and he didn't want to be away from home and feel even more isolated. He was convinced there was no one who would understand what he was going through. But Mary, his wife, persuaded him. That first night at dinner, Ron was astonished to be sitting across the dinner table from two men who had *exactly* the same illness and would be experiencing transplants! They talked far into the night, Ron said, and he was so grateful he had come to Gift of Life Transplant House.


